SAVE — PROJECT ECHO TRAINING — DATE ON SICKLE CELL DISEASE

A Project Extension for Community Healthcare Outcomes (ECHO) training will be held on October 23-24, 2017, in Atlanta, Georgia.

The training will be led by the American Academy of Pediatrics, a Project ECHO Superhub, and will be designed specifically for organizations interested in using the ECHO model™ in their own settings to improve the health care of individuals living with sickle cell disease (SCD). The ECHO model increases access to specialty treatment in rural and underserved areas by building capacity amongst front-line physicians to identify, treat, and manage the care of patients with complex conditions.
